


## NAGPRA Work

What is the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act?

- A law passed in 1990 which requires museums who hold Native American collections to submit summary reports to the National NAGPRA office of any objects that may be sacred, funerary, or cultural patrimony.
- Museums consult with tribal representatives to learn more about collections, with the ultimate goal of the repatriation of sacred cultural objects back to the tribes.
- Letters have gone out to approx 50 tribes across the US, inviting them to review the SRJC Museum's holdings.
- The Museum's first NAGPRA consultation occurred in January, with the Stewart's Point Band of Pomo Indians, and a second consultation is in the works with the Konkow Band of Maidu Indians.
- The SRJC Museum is dedicated to the NAGPRA process, and the return of sacred items to their rightful homes.
